
Dual Enrollment Options in Wisconsin

Transcripted Credit: Opportunity for high school students to earn both high school and technical college credit by participating in courses that are taught in the high school by college-certified high school instructors. Transcripted credit involves a

written contractual agreement between the individual technical college and the school district involved, which must include a cost-neutral arrangement for the school districts and technical colleges involved, and stipulates that students are not charged for the course. All courses taken for technical college credit appear on a student's transcript, and are transferrable to other technical colleges who have the same program.



Advanced Standing: Opportunity for high school students to receive credit for courses once they officially enroll - ("credit in escrow"). The postsecondary institution enters into an agreement with the school based on the high school course content and the demonstrated competency of the high school instructor for the program area of the advanced standing course.

Audit Course: Opportunity for high school students who receive SSI or SSDI to audit any course at a UW system institution at no charge (no charge applies to tuition fees only).

College Credit in High School: Opportunity for high school students to earn both high school and college credit by participating in college level courses that are taught in the high school by college-certified high school instructors. To earn the college credit, the student must pay any tuition amount determined by the college and the district under provisions of Course Options (see separate section below on Course Options). Students must also meet the institution's admissions and course enrollment criteria.

Early College Credit Program: The 2017 Wisconsin Act 59 eliminated the Course Options and Youth Options programs. The Course Options statute was changed to <u>Part-time open enrollment</u>. The Youth Options statute (<u>118.55</u>) was renamed the Early College Credit Program (ECCP). The ECCP statute allows Wisconsin public and private high school students to take one or more courses at an institution of higher education for high school and/or college credit. Under this section, "institution of higher education" means an institution within the University of Wisconsin System, a tribally controlled college, or a private, nonprofit institution of higher education located in the state. While technical colleges are not eligible institutions under the new program, pupils that have completed 10th grade will continue to have the option to take courses at technical colleges through a separate statute, <u>38.12(14)</u>. School districts should contact the Wisconsin Technical College System listed below for more information on technical college dual credit options. All changes are effective 7/1/2018.
